### Preface

As one of our valuable stakeholders, we are extremely grateful for your support in developing the North Wales Skills Portal (Portal). Your contribution and feedback have been integral, and the entire team is thankful for the time and resources you have allocated to support its development.

However, the work is not yet complete, and as we prepare for the public launch in early 2025, we need your final feedback on how to make the Portal as user-friendly as possible.

This stakeholder information pack will provide you with key messages and information necessary for the next stage of the Portal's launch. Please get in touch if you have any questions.

Earlier in 2023, we conducted a region-wide survey to understand the issues that employers faced whilst developing their workforce.

The research found the main challenges to be a lack of awareness of offers provided, duplication, and difficulty finding the various opportunities that existed within the region.

Following this survey, further market research was conducted using annual surveys, continuous employer engagement and nationwide findings, to paint a broader picture of access to employability services. The results found a consistent pattern and, as a result, a need to provide an easy-to-use, simple platform with local employment, skill, apprenticeship, and training opportunities in one place.

# Market Research Findings

The following were the **main** findings:

70% of employers in the region are facing skill challenges.

Almost 50% of people under 24 don't feel prepared for the job or course they want.

47% of employers stated that 'difficulty finding training providers' was one of the main workforce barriers.

An increase in individuals not in education, training or employment.


## Overview of the Portal

The Portal brings together information on career vacancies, apprenticeships, training opportunities, and career support available in North Wales.

It is a **free-of-charge** online platform that collates regional opportunities in one place. The Portal aims to **make it easier** for people to find these **opportunities and support services** whilst **connecting individuals with employers and providers,** which will, in turn, address skills challenges in the region.

Following its launch, the Portal will not be a static entity, but rather an **evolving platform**. It will be continuously measured, monitored for performance, and adapted to respond to user needs, ensuring its relevance and effectiveness.


### Shaping the Portal



#### 1. Submit and Collaborate

Action: Providers and partners submit events, news, and resources to the North Wales Skills Portal.

Goal: Ensure a comprehensive range of local employment and skills opportunities are accessible



### 4. Inform Improvements


Action: Use the feedback, with the support of a steering group, to make informed changes and enhancements to the portal.

Action: Encourage individuals and employers to use the North Wales Skills Portal.


Goal: Increase engagement and utilisation of the portal's resources.
